His groundbreaking work to develop the Medical Engagement Scale (MES) provides a reliable and valid method of understanding the relationship between medical engagement and organisational performance. Peter's seminal book *Medical Leadership: From the Dark Side to Centre Stage* provides a comprehensive account of the key aspects of medical leadership. It explores how the medical profession has evolved in tandem with administrative and structural aspects of the NHS.

Associate Professor Helen Dickinson

Helen is Associate Professor Public Governance at the Melbourne School of Government and School of Social and Political Sciences, University of Melbourne, Australia. She has also authored, co-authored or edited twelve books on topics such as governance, leadership and the reform of health care.

Paul W Long

Paul is an alumnus of Harvard Kennedy School of Government and a Visiting Fellow at the Australian Institute of Health Innovation. His most recent book on clinical leadership provides a practical guide for tutors, trainees and practitioners.
